### **Year-Round Activities**

- 1. Lunchroom/Playground Duty – Julie VanDenHeuvel-[raison24@aol.com](mailto:raison24@aol.com) – School Year – Lunchtime Daily**  
One area where the school is able to keep expenses low is by relying on volunteer parents to serve as lunchroom/playground monitors during the lunchtime. Volunteers will work with paid staff in the cafeteria and on the playground. Each full school day at least two volunteers are needed during the scheduled lunch/recess time for preK-8.

Our school library relies on volunteers to keep it organized, help children with material selections, and check-in/out materials. All hours volunteered in the library can be credited to TSF.
- 3. Scrip – Louanne Jensen (336-3909) – Year Round – Various times**  
The SCRIP program allows parish and school families to purchase gift cards to many area businesses used for everyday items. When the gift card is purchased, a small percent of the transaction is retained by Our Lady of Lourdes and the rest is directed towards tuition assistance of the school family. Volunteers for this program coordinate the purchase and delivery of SCRIP orders; however, because of the training involved the volunteers for this program must make a commitment to the program for an entire year.

The school participates in the General Mills Box Tops for Education Program. This program furnishes items for the school that are not included in the general budget. Volunteers are needed to cut, count, and prepare the box tops for mailing.

3-4 Volunteers needed for each home Packer Game to help park cars at the Green Bay Distillery. The time commitment is 4-5 hours before each game. Your shift will end when the lot is full or the national anthem starts.

Usually the first fundraiser of the year, the magazine/cookie dough sale is one the larger fundraisers for the school. Volunteers are needed to help get materials ready for the students and sort/hand out cookie dough orders.

 Several times a year, we collect paper from the entire parish and community and sell it to a recycler. We arrange for dumpsters to be parked in the Parish parking lot and receive paper 24 hours a day. Everyone is needed to advertise and contact business owners and neighbors to bring their recycled paper to us.
4. **Night of Keys – Amy Blevins-[Amy.blevins@mpi.com](mailto:Amy.blevins@mpi.com) – May-September – All times are needed and available**  
 This event is the largest fundraiser for the school. The evening includes auctions, food & drinks, raffles, entertainment and a chance to win \$10,000 in cash. Volunteers are needed to support the planning of this event and there are a number of volunteer opportunities available: participation on (and/or leadership of) various planning committees, help with set-up the week of the event, staffing/supporting certain areas the night of the event, and help with tear down afterwards.
5. **Seroogy's Sale – Vicki DeJardin (338-9355) – November-December and February-March - Primarily Weekdays**  
 The school conducts two candy sales during the school year: one in November in time for Christmas and one in February-March in time for Easter. Order forms that are sent home with the children permit families, individuals, neighbors, and/or friends to order boxed candy and/or seasonal items. Volunteers are needed to coordinate the order forms, place order with the Seroogy's, and distribute the candy when orders are filled.
6. **Family Dance –Mohammed and Katie Bey - Part of Catholic Schools Week**  
 The school will arrange a family dance that will be during Catholic Schools Week. This event will include a D.J., food and drinks for purchase. This will take place at an offsite banquet style location. It's a fun time for families to socialize and let the kids dance the night away.

 This team-oriented fundraiser is held in February. During the event, adult teams participate in 8 interactive rounds of trivia questions in various categories. Volunteers are needed to help in the planning stages of the event, setting-up, staffing the event and judging.

 This family event takes place on a Friday during Lent and brings together the entire Parish family.
